Valdosta, GA Impact

HURRICANE IDALIA

Hurricane Idalia made landfall on the coast of Florida's Big Bend the morning of Wednesday, August 30.

The storm was rated as a Category 3 hurricane upon landfall, carrying on to impact Florida, Georgia, South Carolina and producing flooding throughout North Carolina before the system made an exit back into the Atlantic Ocean.

As Idalia approached landfall, God's Pit Crew carefully studied the projected paths and kept continuous contact with partners and officials in the areas that were predicted to receive damage. Once the storm chose its path of destruction, and after discussion with contacts in southern Georgia,

God's Pit Crew was led to deploy to the small town of Valdosta.

The beautiful, historic town is filled with century-old trees that drape massively over the streets and homes of the area. However, the strong winds brought by Hurricane Idalia turned those picturesque trees into vicious weapons crashing through homes, businesses, and power lines. While onsite in Valdosta, team members met Patricia whose house had a giant tree leaning over it. The tree had been uprooted during the storm and was causing a stressful situation because it threatened to fall on Patricia's house at any time – and to make matters worse, the tree was much too close to nearby power lines posing an even greater threat.

She heard the crew explaining that the tree could not be removed under these circumstances, and Patricia began to weep. What was she supposed to do with such a danger hanging over her house and threatening to ruin everything she owned?



While God's Pit Crew's Immediate Response Coordinator, Chris Chiles, continued to try to find a way to remove the giant hazard, Patricia took to calling the power company in hopes of getting the electricity momentarily turned off so that the crews could remove the tree. Patricia had a heart wrenching back and forth exchange with the power company, and took to praying three different times that her request would be heard and fulfilled.

"They called me back," explained Patricia. **"I didn't call them."**

The company ultimately agreed that they would turn the electricity off long enough for God's Pit Crew to remove the tree. Patricia was so relieved that the next time she saw the group of volunteers, she met them on her front porch and began serenading them with a hymn, **"He performs miracles just like He said he would. My God is amazing," she sang. "And He sent some amazing people to me!"** Patricia knew that God had provided a miracle for her through the work of God's Pit Crew.

God's Pit Crew's deployment to Valdosta, Georgia, wrapped up the first week of October. During their time responding, nearly 86 God's Pit Crew volunteers from all over the country provided hope and restoration to 200 families by removing trees, tarping roofs, and mucking out homes devastated by rain – while also ministering to and praying over people. Many who had lost all hope until volunteers in red shirts came and helped – acting just as the hands and feet of Jesus.

Beyond the technical aspects, these workshops foster a sense of camaraderie and teamwork among our staff and volunteers. Building a cohesive and resilient team is integral to navigating the complexities of disaster response. Through hands-on training exercises and collaborative learning experiences, we create an environment where individuals can develop not only their technical skills but also their ability to work seamlessly as part of a unified force.

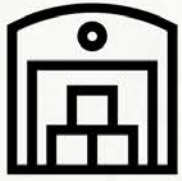




Marjorie Hamilton

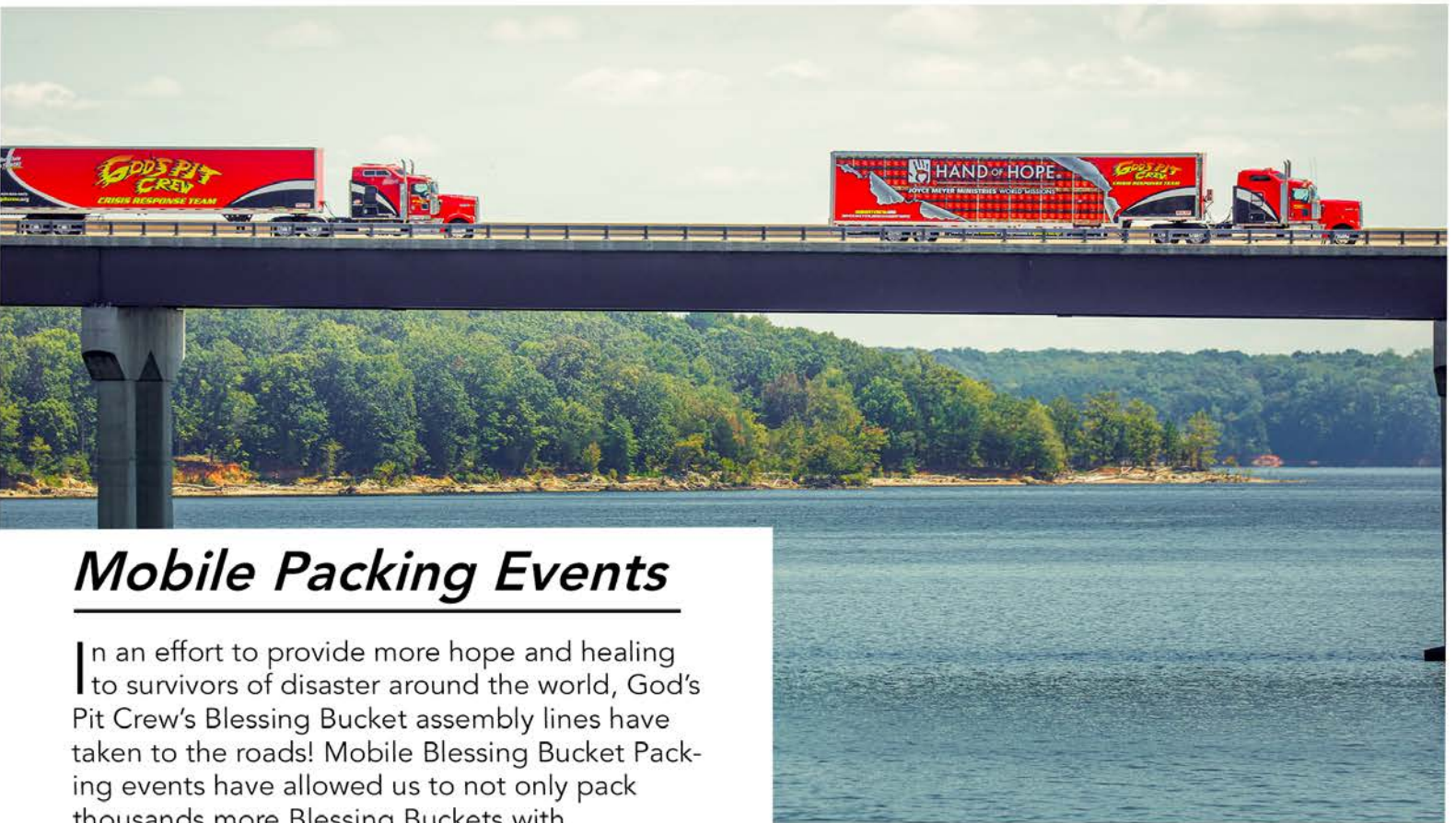

Mobile Packing Events

In an effort to provide more hope and healing to survivors of disaster around the world, God's Pit Crew's Blessing Bucket assembly lines have taken to the roads! Mobile Blessing Bucket Packing events have allowed us to not only pack thousands more Blessing Buckets with much-needed relief supplies, but have also allowed more people to **BE THE BLESSING** by participating in the exciting, worship-filled packing events in their own neighborhoods!

Along with the specially designed assembly lines and tractor-trailer loads full of supplies, in 2023 our volunteer team has traveled throughout Texas, Oklahoma, Florida, and Virginia to host various Mobile Packing Events. These assemblies allowed for an additional 6,000+ Blessing Buckets to be made available for disaster response!

By hosting Mobile Packing Events with several of our trusted ministry partners, God's Pit Crew has been able to increase the amount of Blessing Buckets that can be used when disaster strikes as well as store the life-sustaining buckets in different parts of the world so that they are close by in times of need. And thanks to God's Pit Crew's wonderful partnership with Joyce Meyer Ministries Hand of Hope, many of the mentioned mobile packing events were fully funded and sponsored, allowing different communities to experience this blessing-filled experience.

The Mobile Packing Event in Moffett, Oklahoma, was also a very special commemorative event between God's Pit Crew and Moffett School, as the two organizations have a storied past together. In May 2019, the small town of Moffett, Oklahoma, experienced a devastating flood, impacting every house and structure in the town. Moffett School, which serves students from Pre-K through eighth grade, sustained major damage during the flood.

After talking with pastors, and many residents throughout the small town, there was one consistent request: **"Please help rebuild our school."** God's Pit Crew committed by faith to return to Moffett that August to begin rebuilding the school. The project was fully complete just three weeks after our ministry had set out to restore the school.

As a way to give back to God's Pit Crew, Moffett School spent several months this year holding community and school-wide fundraisers in order to raise enough funds to pack over 1,000 Blessing Buckets right there at the school the same place that once was deemed disaster-stricken and unrepairable.

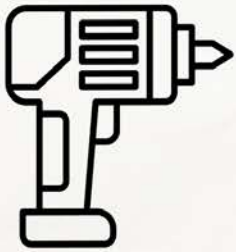

Ellis Family

It is easy to live day-to-day not giving much thought to the many blessings that surround us: a house for shelter, a car for transportation, pots and pans to cook in, blankets for warmth and the list goes on and on.

After being victims of the deadliest flood in middle Tennessee history, Sammy and Vickie Ellis know all too well how it feels to think back on not only all of the possessions they once had, but all of the memories connected to those things. The couple found themselves surrounded by flood waters during the August 2021 storm watching as their home was lifted from its foundation and washed down the street. Their calls for help at the time, not going far.

// We were calling 9-1-1. I bet I called them six times, and each time they said, 'Ma'am there's nothing we can do. We can't get to you. We were just sitting there praying and I kept saying, 'Lord, just let the rain stop.

"We lost our house. We lost all our content inside and out. All our tools and lawn equipment. We lost both vehicles. Very little was salvaged," Vickie Ellis told while recounting the impact the flood had on her family.

"We lost our home that day. We lost our hearts that day. We lost our peace of mind that day. We lost everything we have ever worked toward that day."



Nearly two years after the initial flooding took place, God's Pit Crew was introduced to the Ellis family who were still displaced and searching for ways to move forward after losing so much. God's Pit Crew knew that they had been led to help the Ellis family begin the next chapter of their lives by building them a brand-new home.

On June 23, Sammy and Vickie walked into their new home for the first time. While God's Pit Crew couldn't replace all of the cherished items that held so many special memories for the Ellis family, they prayed that this new home would stand as a new sanctuary where they could find peace and begin making many more precious memories.



“I’m so grateful for all God’s Pit Crew does for those in need. And it’s not minimal or just meeting the need. It’s meeting a desire of the heart,” shared Vickie. **“I feel the many prayers that were prayed over this property and home.”**





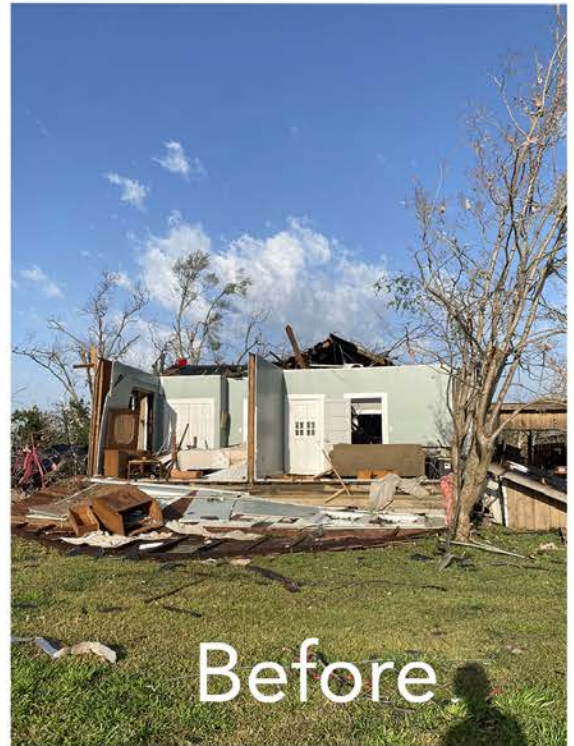
Nichols Family

Rolling Fork, Mississippi

On the night of March 24, 2023, a high-end EF4 tornado ripped through Mississippi destroying much of the small town of Rolling Fork -- home to less than 2,000 residents. Nathan and Kristen Nichols, a young couple who are both school teachers in Rolling Fork, had been working on restoring Nathan's childhood home into their dream home. After dissembling the home all the way back to its original stud work, the couple was beginning to see it nearing their final vision for it.

"I had just put the chandelier in the den on March 22, two days before the tornado hit, so it was still a work in progress, but we were finally seeing it come together," told Nathan. **"Rolling Fork is a place to build a future, and we were finally starting to see that little bit of future."** The tornado barreled down their street just days later. After putting a year's worth of hard work into their house, it was gone in a matter of seconds.

God's Pit Crew's Immediate Disaster Response team deployed to Rolling Fork, Mississippi, immediately following the tornado to help provide aid and comfort to the survivors. While helping clear debris and distribute much-needed relief supplies, the ministry met the Nichols family and learned of their heartbreaking story. In the months following, God provided a way for the ministry to return to the small town and build a brand-new home for the couple who had lost everything.

Berdley Family

Rolling Fork, Mississippi

As the EF4 tornado ravaged its way across the small Mississippi town, Jessica Berdley worried about her two daughters who were spending time at their grandparents' house several miles away.

After wrapping up what seemed to be a typical Friday, the two girls had asked their mother if they could go visit her parents. Jessica delivered the girls to their grandparents' house and was headed back to her house but changed her plans to visit friends a few streets over. While visiting her friends, they began to receive storm warnings on their cellphones to take cover and shelter in place.

"Take cover? We'll never really have to take cover," thought Jessica.

However, this storm cut a path straight through Jessica's life. Not only was her friend's house damaged where she currently was, but the tornado went on to rip apart her house several streets over, and her parents' house where her two daughters were spending the night.

"After the tornado hit, my mom called and said, 'Jessica, we're stuck under a wall. The whole house is gone. We can't move -- we can't get out. We need help,'" Jessica told while recounting the impact the tornado had on her family that traumatic night.

"God was with us that night."

The family miraculously escaped with no injuries. God's Pit Crew was already planning to build a new home for the Nichols family just down the road from Jessica, and the ministry was blessed with the opportunity to be able to build a new home for Jessica and her two daughters, as well.

Letcher, KY Rebuild

Smith Family

If you've never seen a flood just imagine everything that people have worked for is completely ruined.

Imagine having four feet of water in your house. This is the reality for the people there in Letcher, Kentucky." - said Chris Chiles, God's Pit Crew Immediate Disaster Response Coordinator.

The flood that ravaged southeast Kentucky was labeled a "once in every 10,000 years" catastrophic event. Sweeping through 14 counties, killing 45 people and displacing thousands more, this flood was like nothing anyone in the area had ever witnessed before. The Smith family of Letcher, Kentucky, unfortunately understood the magnitude of the flood very well.

Nathan, Jamie, and their children Grace and Harley, watched from the hill facing their home as the rushing water from the nearby creek began to take over their house.

"I just don't understand. I don't understand how this has happened so quick," Jamie told of the horrifying scene that night. "Where's all of the rain coming from? When is it going to stop? I prayed, 'Lord let the rain stop, I can't do anymore. This is as far as I can go.'"

While helping the people of the rural Kentucky town, the Immediate Response team met the Smith family who shared their story of losing everything to the ruinous waters.

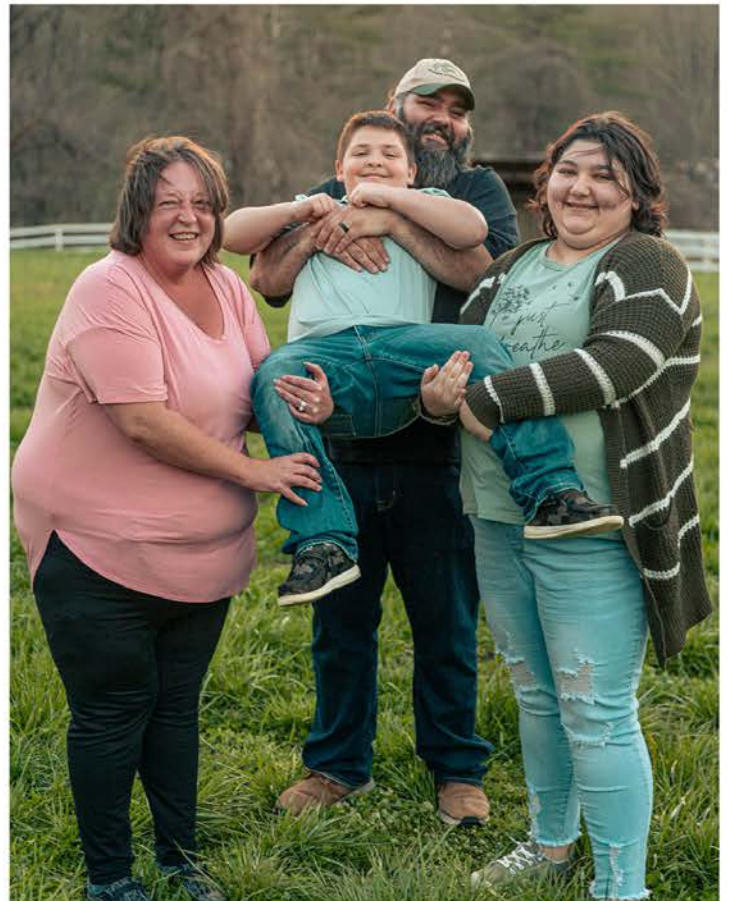


"This couple is hard working, they love the Lord, and they're in a tough spot," reported Chris Chiles, God's Pit Crew Immediate Disaster Response Coordinator. "They desperately needed help." From there, God's Pit Crew went into action planning to build a brand new three-bedroom, two-bathroom home for the Smith family.

Jamie Smith said, "I was hesitant when I first got the phone call. This just doesn't happen. How do people build you a completely free home and furnish it?"

The crew did just that. Nearly 100 volunteers from multiple states came together in Letcher, Kentucky, to build and fully-furnish the new home.

"We've always been able to build these houses with God's help and direction very quickly, but this home in Letcher, Kentucky -- from the first nail being driven to when we walked the family through the front door -- was completed in 10 days," shared Randy Johnson, God's Pit Crew President. "Incredible to see a team of volunteers come together to put a house together with excellence, not just thrown together, in 10 days, start to finish!"



"It's so much better than what we could have ever expected. I couldn't ever dream it would be this beautiful. It's gorgeous," said Jamie Smith. "There are no words to explain what it means to finally be home."



Mobile Home **Fields Family**

God's Pit Crew spent several weeks in Eastern Kentucky last August after devastating floods destroyed multiple communities in the area. The historic flooding last summer swept through 14 counties, killing 45 people and displacing thousands.

During the catastrophic event, the Fields family watched as their home was washed off its foundation and carried over a nearby hill, finally lodging between the riverbanks as flood waters continued to rush around and through it.

The devastated home remained in shambles for months hanging over the river that flanked the highway where it once stood. as the region worked to safely clean up all debris spread throughout the region.

God's Pit Crew volunteers and staff began a week's worth of hard work in Jenkins, Kentucky, placing a new foundation and modular home for the Fields family. The home was specifically formatted to meet the family's needs – including the addition of a ramp for easy accessibility into the home – and was given to the family at no cost.

The summer months brought turmoil across the state of Texas. Tornadoes ripped through multiple regions leaving behind devastating scenes of homes destroyed and families left without any of their possessions.

God's Pit Crew sent three tractor-trailer loads of relief supplies to multiple Texas towns following the catastrophic storms. The first semi-load of product was delivered to Perryton, Texas, the second to Longview, Texas, and the third to Matador, Texas.

Then, a story made its way to God's Pit Crew of a young couple -- getting ready to welcome their first child -- who had lost their home to straight line winds in the Sulphur Springs, Texas, area. Brody and Brooklyn Thoms had just finished renovating their current mobile home in preparation of welcoming their little girl, but the devastating winds came through and ripped the mobile home apart leaving it in shambles strewn across the nearby field.

God's Pit Crew felt led by the Lord to partner with local churches to provide this growing family with a new mobile home. "After the storm, I went out into the field and fell on my knees and prayed to God," told Brody Thoms. **"God, You don't have to worry about me. I'm not going to quit on You. I'm still going to serve You because I thank You for what You've already given to me and for what You're going to do,"** prayed Thoms.

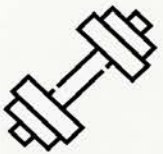

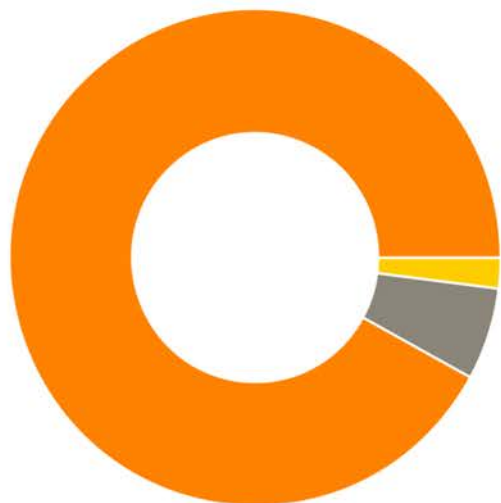
